Dear Mayor, Councillors and supporters of Ride2School,

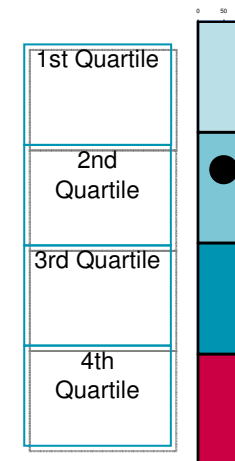

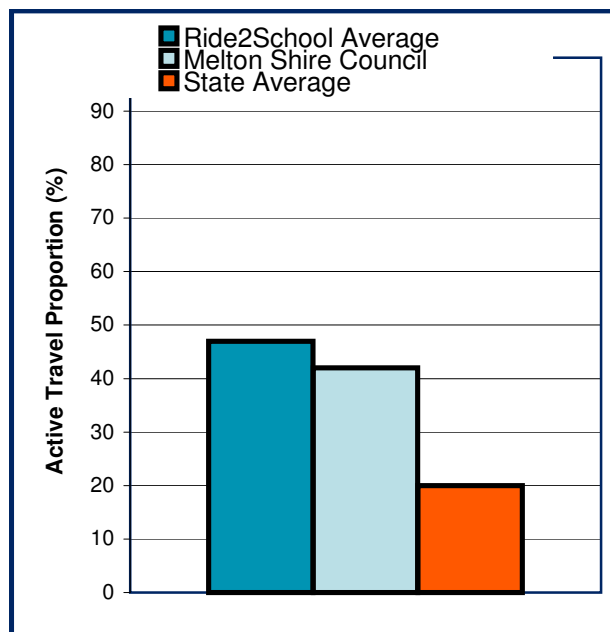

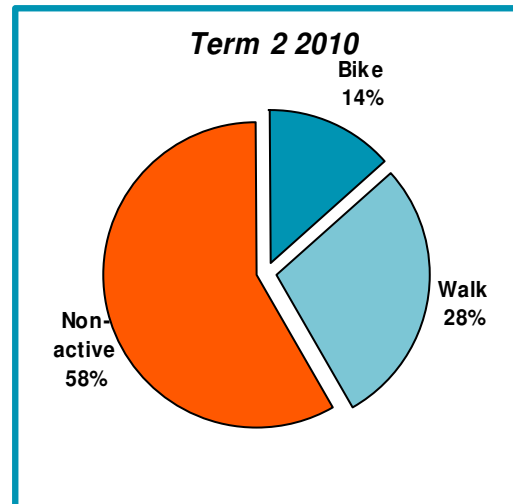
