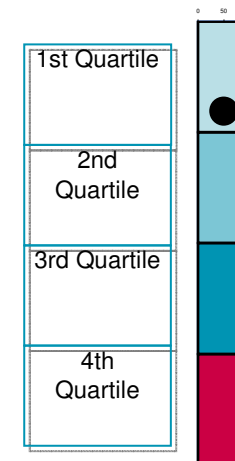

Top 4 Local Councils

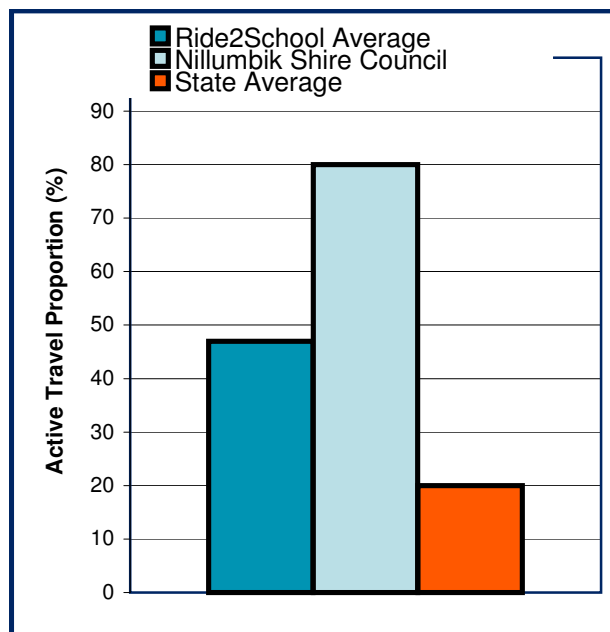

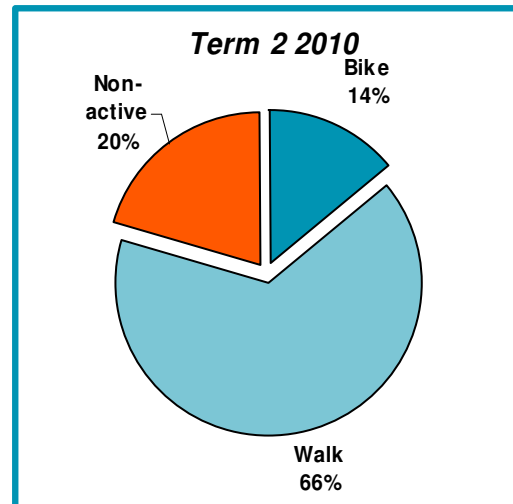
