The Challenge

To help those riders unable to continue due to mechanical or body breakdown and to ensure information is passed through the right channels for follow up.

Team Outline	
Team purpose (outcomes)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> To pick up any riders that are injured or have had mechanical issues that can't be fixed on route Communicate information to route control and medical for follow up
How the team gets the job done (actions)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Drive a 12 or 22 seater bus with a trailer attached to collect riders and their bikes Work in teams of 2 and share the driving Drive safely along the rider route to shuttle unable riders Help riders load their bikes onto the trailer Use radios to communicate progress to route control Fill out sag books and hand in to medical and/or information teams at the end of the day. Attend a nightly briefing with Route Control if required

Physical work	Some lifting of bikes
Customer contact	Customer Service focus
Sitting / Standing	Sitting in a car mostly
Outdoor exposure	On route –all conditions
Location	On route

Qualifications	Heavy vehicle/bus licence depending on size of vehicle, first aid an advantage. Experience in driving a long vehicle with a trailer an advantage.
Cash handling	None
Equipment loaned (need to return at end of Ride)	Radio
Equipment supplied	Vehicle and trailer, water and blankets for Riders
First day duties	Sag Wagon team duties
Last day duties	Sag wagon team duties
Required start and end date	Volunteers are required the day before official start day to familiarise self with vehicle and route notes. Finish at the end of the final day.
