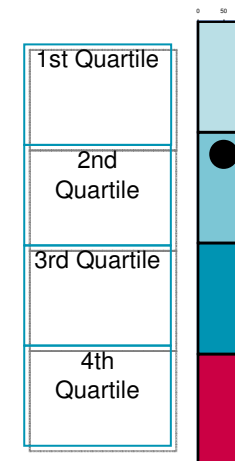

Top 4 Local Councils

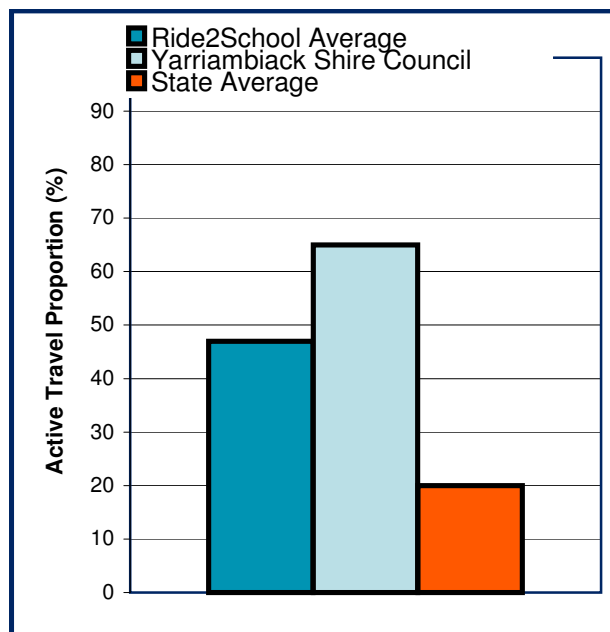

Gold Medal Challenge

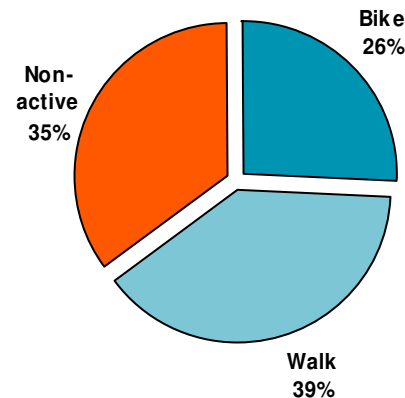
