The Challenge – role, responsibilities and outcomes	
Role description:	You will be a part of the motorcycle marshal team to assist the route operations team by completing visual sweeps of the route and reporting any issues immediately. Responding to any accidents or issues on the ride in a safe and effective manner. You will provide immediate assistance to rider accidents.
Key responsibilities:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Enhance the enjoyment of the ride for participants, volunteers and the public, by ensuring the motorcycle marshals respond to accidents on route in a safe manner. • Provide immediate response to rider accidents on route. • Communicate with Route Control to ensure the correct operational progression of the event. • Ensure riders receive first aid assistance in the event of an accident. • Completing visual sweeps of the route and reporting debris and unsafe road surfaces immediately for action. • Deal with incidents with courtesy and good humour and resolving problems and / or complaints cheerfully and effectively. • To project a positive public image on behalf of both the Volunteers and Bicycle Victoria.
Outcomes:	Contribute to rider safety and ensure a clear and safe route. You will also create a welcoming presence so that riders enjoy and feel a part of the event. Act as the first response to any en route incidents and monitor the progress of the event throughout the day. Volunteers will work safely and respectfully with each other.
