The Challenge – role, responsibilities and outcomes	
Role description:	To drive the Sag Wagon that is a means of transport for riders unable to continue due to mechanical or physical breakdown during the ride. You will be in direct communications with route central control who will advise you of rider locations requiring assistance. You will work in pairs, sharing the driving.
Key responsibilities:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Drive a 12 or 25 seater bus with a trailer attached to collect riders and their bikes • Work in teams of 2 and share the driving • Drive safely along the rider route to shuttle unable riders to the next rest area • Help riders load their bikes onto the trailer • Use radios to communicate progress to route control • Complete and return sag books to information team.
Outcomes:	Riders who encounter mechanical or physical difficulties during the ride will feel supported by you. With your assistance these riders will not be left stranded, where their problem will be addressed in the best possible way. Volunteers will work safely and respectfully with each other.
