Experience / skills required:	Understanding of site logistics, signage implementation, equipment requirements, good communication skills

Rider contact:	Minimal Rider contact
The Challenge – role, responsibilities and outcomes	
Role description:	As per the signage schedule you will clearly sign the route for riders to navigate their way and be warned of obstacles and hazards. You will also sign the route for vehicles where appropriate. This will in turn ensure riders get from town to town without losing their way.
Key responsibilities:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Preparing the signs at the BV workshop into vans ready for distribution along the route. • Transport signs to and from the route. • Putting all signs in place for route opening time between Falls Creek and Dinner Plain. • Looking out for hazards on the route. If any, report back to route control for action. • Collect all signs at end of the day and clearing any related rubbish when the route closes between Dinner Plain and Falls Creek. • Transport and unpack signs back to the workshop for storage.
Outcomes:	The route will be clearly identifiable to riders, support vehicles and motorists ensuring for successful completion of the ride. All equipment will be cared for, used properly and returned in good condition. Volunteers will work safely and respectfully with each other.
