The Challenge – role, responsibilities and outcomes	
Role description:	As part of the First Aid evacuation team you will provide medical aid and transportation support to riders on route as required. In particular provide transportation (in the event that ambulance response time is lengthy) to local medical care to riders who consent.
Key responsibilities:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Prepare first aid equipment and vehicles • Provide first aid services to cyclists. • To refer ride participants to local medical care when appropriate. • In the event of a serious incident always contact an ambulance on 000, and liaise with route central control. • Also liaise with our medical staff if a serious incident occurs. • Record and log the treatment details of each ride participant treated • Refer ride participants to other event team members where appropriate.
Outcomes:	Your team will ensure completion of a safe ride by all riders where any Medical Aid issues are dealt with in a friendly professional manner. You will ensure a medical presence on course on event day. Volunteers will work safely and respectfully with each other.
