2. What's your reasons for your answer to question one?

All reasons based on my own personal experiences:

- 37 Years of cycling in Australia, no injuries to myself or others irrespective of whether I was wearing a helmet or not
- Safe accident and injury free 10 years on motorcycles with 7 years as Motorcycle teacher
- Hats and helmets may not fit securely and safely or may interfere with wearers visibility
- Headlamps and helmets may not fit well together
- Hearing difficulties from Wind noise caused by straps
- Helmet hair
- Effects on skin and scalp health
- Overheating on hot days a problem especially for elderly and those with other health problems
- Attachments to helmets for added sun protection such as neck flaps can result in dangerous vision impairing saccadic masking type effect, as well as distracting wind noise.
- When raining can't wear helmet and rain jacket hood easily or change comfortably when on/off bike
- Compulsory helmet laws reduce the number of people riding bicycles which correlates with lower cyclist safety statistics, more vehicles, car centric roads, cities and urban planning along with pollution
- Damage to good will relationship between police and citizens
- Sharing bike share helmets can be off putting or unhygienic especially with rain or sweat
- Convenience not having to lock up, carry helmet, take on off
- Enjoyment, pleasure and mental health benefits from riding without helmet
- Time consuming anxiety causing road side police discussions sometimes leading to both District and Magistrates Court appearances where I have successfully defended myself against the mandatory helmet law due to health wearing hat instead and my refined legal skills
