What is Cardinia Creek Regional Parklands?

Cardinia Creek Regional Parklands will expand and link together parks and open spaces that are much loved by the community. The parklands are located on the lands of the Bunurong People and are being expanded to protect nature and create more open space, walking and cycling trails for locals and visitors to enjoy.

The project is part of the Victorian Government's \$154 million Suburban Parks Program. The parklands will span 508 hectares from Beaconsfield to Clyde North.

Why are we expanding the parklands?



To provide more accessible, green, open space for the growing population. The expanded parklands will stretch over six suburbs in Melbourne's south-east



To protect our plants and animals. The creek and its surroundings are home to 20 rare and threatened species of flora and 37 species of fauna



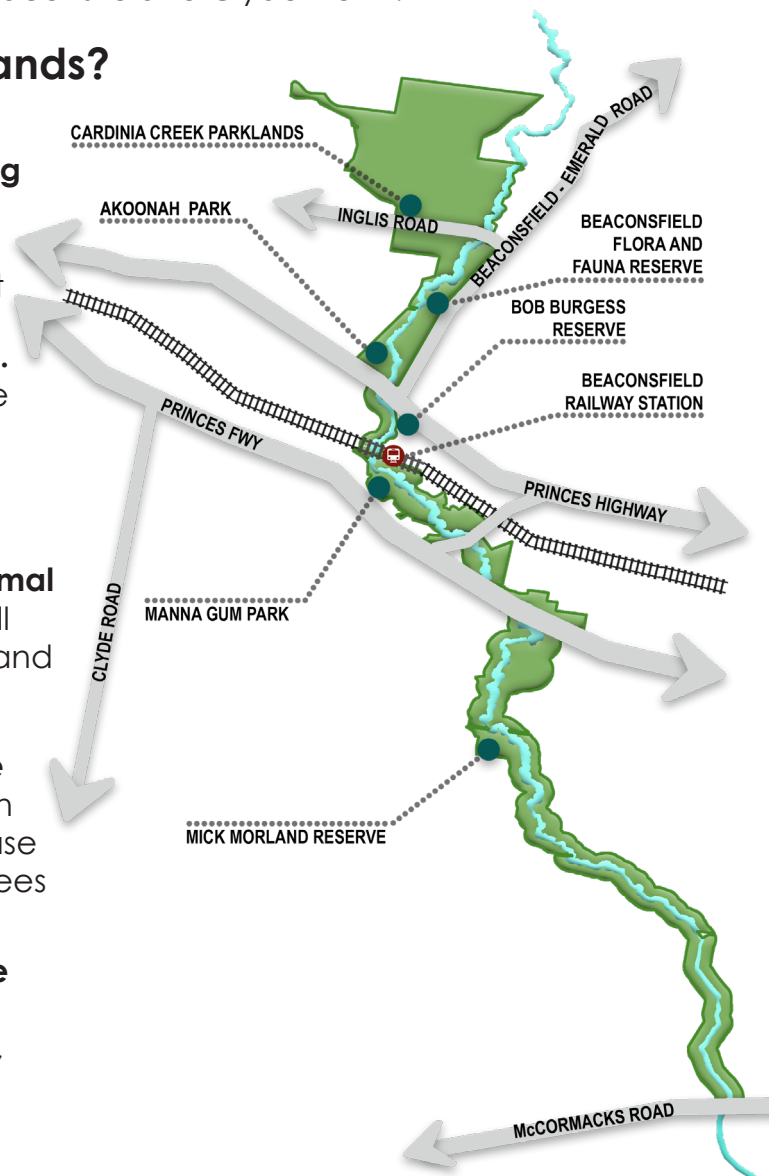
To increase opportunities for informal recreation. The parklands plan will identify trails for walking, cycling and horse riding



To help communities adapt to the effects of climate change through parkland planning we can increase the canopy cover provided by trees



Supporting the cultural landscape of the Bunurong People through collaborative land management, language, artwork and signage

The creation of Cardinia Creek Regional Parklands will be guided by a refresh of the Cardinia Creek Regional Parklands Future Directions Plan. The plan is being delivered by the ongoing public land managers and Traditional Owners, who will manage the expanded Cardinia Creek Regional Parklands. The plan will be developed with the community and key stakeholders.

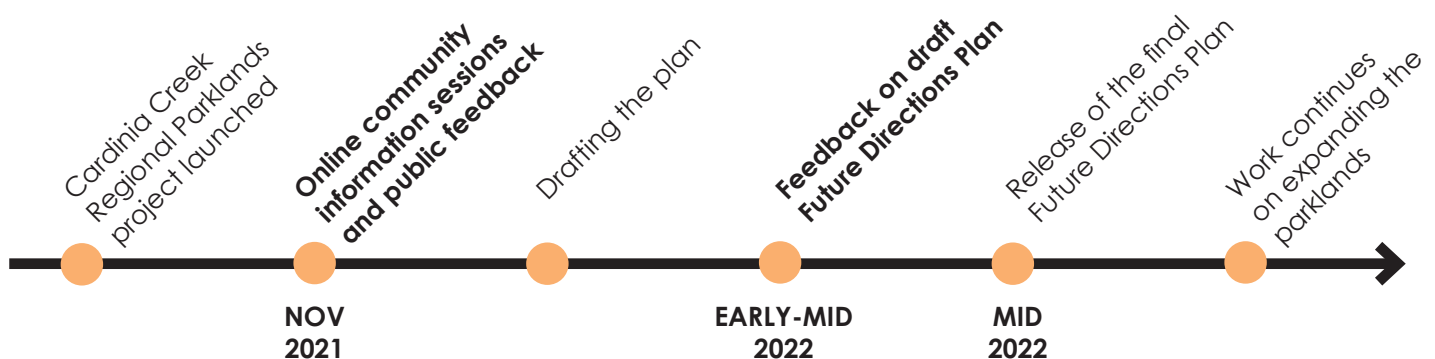
How can people get involved?

We want to know what you value in the parklands, how you currently use the parklands and what you would like to see and do in the parklands in the future. Your input will guide the plan refresh. You will have another opportunity to provide feedback on the draft plan next year.

When will the project be completed?

Visitors can visit Cardinia Creek Parklands now including Beaconsfield Flora and Fauna Reserve and Manna Gum Park. The entire parklands will be opened in stages with expansion occurring over many years. The Cardinia Creek Regional Parklands Future Directions Plan will guide this expansion and will be completed by mid-2022.

Work to create new trails and a viewing platform in Cardinia Creek Parklands, south of Inglis Road, is underway and due to be completed in June 2022.
