RESPONSE:

1. What is your view regarding the current active transport infrastructure in your electorate?

In Kew, although we have a number of beautiful off-road cycling paths, we're severely lacking in dedicated bicycle lanes. The goal of the Greens is to promote the uptake of active transport in all areas, and that includes supporting the build of new infrastructure to support this, in addition to ensuring there are adequate connections to public transport.

2. What actions will you take to improve active transport in your electorate?

The Victorian Greens have committed \$2.5 billion dollars over the next four years to implement a 'Big Bike Build' with hundreds of kilometres of safe and separated bike lanes! In Kew, I would support the implementation of the Strategic Cycling Corridor network throughout the electorate.

3. Active transport spending at the state level is less than 2 per cent. In your view, what is a 'fair spend' for active transport?

Given that over two thirds of Victorians would like to walk or ride their bikes more, it is imperative we invest more in infrastructure to support this. The Greens commit to a 10-20% spending at a state level for active transport.
